Elective credit

Introduction to Law teaches students to 'think like a lawyer' while also exposing them to the wide range of law-related careers. Students will read and analyze court cases, perform mock trials, listen to guest speakers from the legal community, and visit local courts and meet judges. Students should be prepared to make regular speeches and oral arguments in front of classmates. Students will learn criminal law, legal process, rights and responsibilities and the justice process.

Content Covered/Course Learning Targets:

International Law:

- A. *Students will be able to identify different types of International government bodies and functions of said entity.*
- B. *Students will be able to differentiate between a democracy and other forms of governments.*
- C. *Students will be able to identify laws of a foreign country and present a compare and contrast power-point with the laws in the United States.*
- D. *Students will be able to identify conflicts and issues within a foreign government and predict outcomes based on recent and past history.*
- E. *Students will be able to understand the concept of "passive resistance" as a means of effective and legal protest.*

Fundamentals of Law:

- A. *Students will be able to define Law.*
- B. *Students will be able to differentiate between different types of law.*
- C. *Students will be able to explain why society has laws*
- D. *Students will be able to give general purpose for criminal and civil law*

Settling Disputes:

- A. *Students will be able to give examples of conflict resolution techniques.*
- B. *Students will be able to explain examples for solving disputes between two or more parties.*

Court System

- A. *Students will be able to understand the court proceedings and process in the following court systems:*
1. *Trial Court*
 2. *Appeals Courts*
 3. *Federal and State Court Systems*
 4. *Supreme Court of the United States*
 5. *International Court*

Lawyers

- A. *Students will be able to identify key examples of when and when not to use an attorney.*

Criminal Law and Juvenile Justice

- A. *Student will be able to identify key factors in our national-state-local areas that promote social unrest.*
B. *Students will be able to take a side of a controversial debate topic and argue for or against the legalization*
C. *Students will be able to identify capital crimes.*
D. *Students will be able to identify crimes against property.*

Criminal Justice Process

- A. *Students will be able to explain the Miranda Rights process*
B. *Students will be able to describe the criminal trial procedure in local and state courts.*

Family Law

- A. *Students will be able to identify the stipulations between separation and divorce.*
B. *Students will be able to list and explain the options in child custody disputes.*

Learning Behaviors: In addition to academic grading, our student will be assessed on three behavior categories:

STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

Mastering the learning targets in Physical Education requires students to be able to actively participate and improve in areas of personal management. To be successful, students must:

1. Be **actively involved** in class, **ask questions, contribute to the competitive atmosphere.**
2. **Complete or attempt all assigned warm-ups and bell ringer activities.**
3. **Ask for help and ask questions** of fellow students (when appropriate) and the teacher (when appropriate) when you are confused or don't understand.
4. **Come to class prepared – paper – notebook – textbook – pen/pencil.**
5. **Be a leader by demonstrating skills and techniques in each unit.**
6. **Do not distract** self and/or others students from the opportunity to learn.
7. **Follow the guidelines** set by the school and the district student behavior code, a cell phone referral will be issued as per CAHPS discipline policy.
8. Come to class **on time.**
9. **In group-work - work to your full potential.**
10. Remember that other electronic devices should not be in class. Students must ask permission to use rest-room facilities during class time. Students may not leave class without permission.
